The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS Edward Lawrence, late Mariner on Board the Phœnix Cutter, of Chrift Church in the County of Southampton, Thomas Northcaft, of Alderbury in the County of Wilts, Labourer, George Vincent, of Kingston in the County of Dorset, Labourer, ——— Russell, of - Russell, of the fame Place, Labourer, and ----- Dominy, commonly known by the Name of Black-One, Dominy, otherwife Black-Throat, of the fame Place, Labourer, and divers other Perfons, to the Number of Three Perfons and more, were, upon the Seventeenth Day of November last, charged by Infor-mation of a credible Perfon, upon Oath by him. fubscribed, besore Robert Pope Blachford, Efq: one of His Majefty's Justices of the Peace in and for the faid County of Southampton, with having been guilty, on the Sixth Day of: he faid Month of November, of being armed with Fire Arms and other offenfive Weapons, to wit, with Carbines, Bludgeons, and large Clubs, and of having affembled themfelves together near Bourne Bottom, in the faid County of Southampton, in order to be the faid County of Southampton, in order to be aiding and affitting in refcuing and taking away, after Seizure made by one of the Officers of His Majefty's Revenue of Excife. a large Quantity, to wit, Twenty Gallons of Foreign Brandy and Foreign Geneva, the fame being uncultomed Goods, and Goods liable to pay Duties, which had not been paid or fecured, and with having been aiding and affifting in refcuing and taking away from the faid Officer of His Majefty's Reaway from the faid Officer of His Majesty's Re-venue of Excile the faid Foreign Brandy and Foreign Geneva, after Seizure thereof; which In-formation was afterwards, by the faid Robert Pope Blachford, Efq; certified under his Hand and Seal, and returned to One of His Majefly's Prin-cipal Secretaries of State, who has laid the fame before His Majefly in His Privy Council, purfuant to the Act of Parliament of the Nineteenth Year of His late Majefly King George the Second, in that Cafe made and provided :--His Majefly doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by this His Order in His Privy Council, require and command, that the faid Edward Lawrence. Tho-- Ruffell, mas Northcaft, George Vincent, -

and -Dominy, commonly known by the Name of Black-One, otherwife Black-Throat, and each of them, do furrender himfelf and themfelves, within the Space of Forty Days after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, to the Lord Chief Justice, or One other of His Majesty's Justices of the Court of King's Bench, or to One of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace.
