N Imperial Declaration has been published here, by which the following Duties ad Valorem are laid on Glass imported into these Dominions; over and above the former Tolls and Transit Duties.

On rough Glass, not polithed, five per Cent. On polished Glass, not filvered, ten per Cent. On filvered Glass, fifteen per Cent;

And on Glass framed, whether silvered or not, alio fifteen per Cent.

The Declaration on Entry, respecting the Dimen-tions of foreign Glass imported, and the Collection of the Duties, are to be conformable to the Ordonnance of the 30th of October, 1786.
