**A**N Imperial Declaration has been published here, by which the following Duties ad Valorem are laid on Glafs imported into these Dominions; over and above the former Tolls and Transit Duties.

- On rough Glafs, not polished, five per Cent.
- On polished Glafs, not silvered, ten per Cent.
- On silvered Glafs, fifteen per Cent;
- And on Glafs framed, whether silvered or not, also fifteen per Cent.

The Declaration on Entry, respecting the Diminutions of foreign Glafs imported, and the Obligation of the Duties, are to be conformable to the Ordonnance of the 30th of October, 1786.
