At the General Quarter Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, at the Guildhall within the said City, on Tuesday the Eighth Day of January, in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, King of Great Britain, &c. before John Burnell, Esquire, Mayor of the City of London, Bras Crosby, Esquire, Richard Clark, Esquire, Aldermen of the said City, James Adair, one of His Majesty's Serjeants at Law, Recorder of the said City, William Pickett, Esquire, one other of the Aldermen of the said City, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lord the King, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lord the King, within the said City, and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trepasses, and other Misdemeanors committed within the said City.

BE it remembered, That the Inspector of Corn Returns hath this Day, in open Court, presented and delivered to the Lord Mayor, Recorder and Aldermen, assembled at this present Session, a certain Book into which the States or Accounts of the General Aggregate Quantities, Prices, and Average Prices of English Barley, Beans, Malt, Oats, Peafe, Rye and Wheat, bona fide sold and delivered between the 15th Day of October and the 29th Day of December last, by each and every Corn-factor dealing by Commission in the Sale of Corn or Grain in the Corn-Exchange, London, have been made up, formed, computed and distinguished, and fairly and properly inserted; and hath verified upon his Oath that the same have been fairly and properly made up, formed and computed, to the best of his Power, Skill and Judgment, and according, so far as in him lay, to the true Intent and Tenor of the Act of Parliament in that Behalf: And the General Average Prices of each of the said respective Sorts of Corn and Grain thereby appearing to the said Lord Mayor, Recorder and Aldermen, they do hereby, in pursuance of the said Act, deem and certify the same to be as follows, that is to say,
