Vienna, March 1.

The Emperor set out very early Yesterday Morning for Trieste, by the Way of Gratz and Laubach, at each of which Cities he will stop one Day; so that he will hardly reach Trieste before the 6th Instant.

Marshal Lacy departed this Morning for the Army, which has suffered a real Loss by the sudden Decease of General Caramelli, who held, under Marshal Haddick, the second Place in the War Department.
