*Rome*, Jan. 26. The Cardinal Landgrave of *Hesse* formerly made Protector of the affairs of the Empire in this Court, has received his dispatches from *Spain*, by which he is likewise, by that Court, made and confirmed Protector for *Catalonia*, and the Kingdom of *Arragon*, in place of the late Cardinal *Colonna*.

His Holiness has ordered six of his stoutest Gallies, with his Standard to be fitted up to joyn with seven others of *Milthia*, to be ready to sail the next *April* for the *Levant*, to assist the *Venetians* in their Wars: Having likewise much pressed the Great Duke of *Tuscany* to employ likewise his Gallies in the same service, encouraging also the other Princes of *Italy*, to assist them with what succors they are able to lend them.

*Legorne*, Jan. 31. 'Tis confidently said, That the *Venetians* have made a peace with the *Turks*, obliging themselves to demolish the impregnable Forts and Port of *Suda*. The *Turks* to do the like to *Candia Nuova*, and to allow 15. miles of Territory round about *Candia*, to the *Venetian* Jurisdiction; the certainty we may expect hereafter.

*Genoua*, Feb. 2. The States Convoy from *Spain*, is at the last safely arrived here, to our great satisfaction; they being Vessels of very considerable value; with them came in two other Vessels of this place from *Lisbonne*: No other of our Fish Ships as yet appear, either here or at *Legorne*. This Convoy is to be speedily returned again for *Spain*, and with it several Ships for *Lisbonne*.

One of the Ships employed to transport Soldiers into *Spain* from *Finale*, has been unhappily cast away, and in her above 300 Soldiers, onely one man escaping the Wreck:

'Tis said that the King of *France* has lately wrote to the Duke of *Savoy*, to forbear his design of fortifying *Trino*, a place of great importance in *Montferrat*, not far distant from *Casal*; which he has done in favor to the Duke of *Mantoua*, who has some pretensions to that place, upon the account of some ancient Treaties; being unwilling he should have any occasion given him to desert the French interest.

*Cassel*, Feb. 2. The Treaty of a Marriage of the Prince Royal of *Denmark* with our Princess, is so far advanced by the persuasion of his Electoral Highness the Marquis of *Brandenburgh*, that preparations are making for its solemnization; and 'tis believed, that the Prince will be here in person towards *Easter*.
