Vienna, August 27.

The last Letters from the Bannat advile, that the Emperor arrived at Weißkirchen on the 20th In-ftant. Whilft His Imperial Majefty was on his March, the Turks made strong Efforts to penetrate into the Heart of that Province. They attacked a Defile, called the Veteranifche Hole, with great Fury, made themfelves Masters of an advanced Post; and put to the Sword two Divisions of Brechainville's Regiment of Foot, giving Quarter neither to Officers nor Soldiers. They made feveral unfuc-cessful Attempts to carry the principal Poft, but weré always beat back with great Lofs. This however appeared to be only a fecondary Object with them. Their principal one was to drive General Wartensleben from the Heights, where his Corps was advan-tageoufly posted near Meadia. For that Purpose, the Serafkier of Georgia was detached, on the 17th Inftant, with a Corps of 16,000 Men, mostly Spahis, to attack that General, whole Force conflited of about 8,000 Men. The Action began early in the Morning, and was fo ill conducted on the Part of the Turks; that the Austrian Infantry (from behind their Redoubts) had little elfe to do than to mow down the Turkish Ranks, as they rashly advanced within the Reach of Grape Shot. To this Carnage they exposed themselves repeatedly, during the Course of the Day, but with out ever making the fmalleft Impression on the
