All the Ships expected from the Black Sea are returned into Harbour, amounting to Sixty-five Sail; as is also the Squadron lately arrived at the Dardanelles, consisting of Three Ships of the Line, Four Frigates, and One small Sloop, together with Three Russian Prizes. Two Ships of the Line, Three Frigates, and One Sloop, are now on their Departure, to join a nearly equal Force which was left cruising for the Defence of the Ottoman Coasts and the Islands in the Archipelago.

No Accident of the Plague has been verified in this Capital since the 9th Instant.
