Yesterday Morning the Diet was solemnly proclaimed in the different Quarters of the Town by the Principal Herald, attended by Four Under Heralds, the Trumpets and Kettle Drums, and a Body of Horse of the Corps of Burghers. During this So-lemnity there was a Levee at Court, at which his Majesty, after a short Speech to the Members of the Senate, declared Count Charles Emilius Lowenhaupt Marihal of the Diet, who immediately took the Oath of Office before the King, as did also the Archbishop of Upsala, as Speaker of the Clergy. The Staff was afterwards delivered by his Majesty to the Marshal, and the Ceremony ended with his Introduction into the House of Nobles by Count Brahe, Primary Count of the Realm.
