At this Time of univerfal Joy and Happinefs diffufed throughout your Majesty's Dominions by the blessed Interpofition of Divine Providence, in refifting to His faithful Subjects our beloved Sovereign, we cannot fufficiently exprefs the lively Senfe of Regard and Gratitude we feel for your Majesty, who, by your Goodnefs, and the Wifdom of your Councils, have raifed this Country to it's prefent Glory and Profperity.

The peculiar Situation of this Borough, which is more immediately under your Majesty's Protection, particularly calls upon us to fhew our great Loyalty, and our extreme Joy and Happinefs upon this blessed Occafion, which we cannot fet forth in Terms adequate to our Feelings.

We fervently pray that your Majesty may long live and enjoy a Series of uninterrupted Happinefs and Profperity; and we humbly beg Leave to affure your Majesty, that our warmeft Interests are and ever will be engaged towards the Effect of every private Comfort and Wifh of your Majesty in your Royal Refidence among us.

Ordered, That this Adrefs be transmitted to the Secretaries of State, to be by them prefented to His Majesty.

which, in Compaffion to this Land, it hath pleafed Him to reftore; fo that your Majesty may long reign not only over the Perfons, but, as you now do, in the Hearts and Affections of a grateful People. Dated in the College of Eton, the 18th Dzy of March, in the Year of our Lord 1789.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Adrefs of the Gentlemen, Clergy and Principal Inhabitants of the City and Suburbs of Winchefter.

Impreffed with the deepeft Senfe of the Divine Goodnefs in refifting your Majesty to the Wifhes and the Prayers of your faithful, affectionate and loyal Subjects, we beg Leave, (after having acknowledged the Goodnefs of Almighty God in attending to thofe Prayers) to approach your Sacred Majesty with Affurances of the moft unshaken Loyalty, Duty and Attachment, and to entreat, that your Majesty will believe there is no Part of your Subjects who rejoice more cordially in the happy Event of our again enjoying the Blessings of your mild and juft Government than we do.
