FITZ-GIBBON, C. JOHN FOSTER.

Kingdom, which now stands prorogued to Monday the Twenty-seventh Day of July instant, be further prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-ninth Day of September next; We do therefore publish and declare, that the said Parliament be, and accordingly the said Parliament is, hereby further prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-ninth Day of September next: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament, are to take Notice accordingly.
