and Church-Warden of the Parish where they refide, if in Great Britain, or an Oath to be made by the Subscriber of the Life of fuch Nominee before a Judge or Justice of Peace in the County or Place of Refidence of faid Nominee. No Fee or Stamp Duty to be paid for these Oaths or Certificates.

27. If any Nominee or Nominees be refident in Ireland when Application shall be made for the Payment of his, her or their Annuity, Certificates must be produced, under the Hand of One or more of the Barons of the Exchequer in that Kingdom, that, upon Proof to him or them made upon Oath, it doth feem probable to him or them that faid Nominee or Nominees are living at the Time of fuch Examination; and in Cafe any Nominee shall, at the Times of such Demand, be resident in any Parts of His Majefly's Dominions beyond Sea, Certificates of the Life of fuch No-minee must be produced, under the Hand of the Governor or Deputy Governor of the Set-tlement where fuch Nominees fhall be living, on the Day when fuch Half-yearly Payment shall become due; or if such Nominee shall be refident in any Foreign Country in Amity with His Majefty, then the Certificate must be under the Hand of the British Minister resident at the Place where fuch Nominee shall then be; or if any Nominee shall be resident in any other Foreign Country where there is no British Minister, then the Certificate of the Life of fuch Nominee muft be under the Hand of the Chief Magistrate of the Place or Province where fuch Nominee shall then be living

29. Any Perfon knowingly receiving any Annuity on the Life of any Nominee after the Deceafe of faid Nominee, over and above what was due to fuch Nominee at the Time of his or her Deceafe, is to forfeit treble the Value of the Sum fo unjuftly received, and also the further Sum of Five Hundred Pounds.

30. All Proprietors of One or more Shares in the Tontine are required to give Notice to the Auditor of the Exchequer of the Death of his or her Nominee or Nominees, within One Month after the fame shall have come to their Knowledge, under a Penalty of Ten Pounds.

37. Lifts of the Nominees still living will be annually published by the Lords of the Treasury, and distributed amongst the Persons entitled to Annuities, gratis.

Annuities, gratis. 38. Any Officer of the Exchequer taking any Fee for transacting any Bufiness respecting the Tontine is to forfeit Twenty Pounds.
