Stockholm, August 4.

Accounts received from Finland mention a very smart Action, which took Place on the Evening of the 20th of July, near Parkumäki, between the Corps commanded by Brigadier-General Steding, and the Russian Troops under Lieutenant-General Schultz,

in which the Russians were forced to retreat, with the Loss of Two Hundred killed, and between Four and Five Hundred taken Prisoners, with the Cannon, Ammunition and Baggage.

Brussels, August 18.

The Fermentation in this Country increases every Day. On the 14th Instant a Tumult happened at Tournay, where a Person having bought a considerable Quantity of Corn at the Market, was taken into Custody as a Monopolist. The Alarm Bell having been rung, the Populace assembled, and pillaged Five Houses; but the few Troops that were in the Town, assisted by the Bourgeois, and a Party of the Regiment of Murray, which had arrived from Mons, soon restored Tranquillity, though not without firing upon the Insurgents, by which Five of them were killed.

A great Number of young Men having received Passports from the Magistrates of this Town, are gone towards the Frontiers; but this Morning Orders are issued by the Government to prohibit the Magistrates from granting any more Passports, unless to Persons well known.
