Stockholm, August 4.

Accounts received from Finland mention a very fmart Act on, which took Place on the Evening o the 20th of July, near Parkum ki, between the Corps coramanded by Brigadier-General Steding, and the Ruffian Troops under Lieutenant-General Schultz,

in which the Rufflans were forced to retreat, with the Lois of Two Hundred killed, and between Four and Five Hundred taken Prifoners, with the Cannon, Ammunition and Baggage.

The Fermentation in this Country increases every Day. On the 14th Instant a Tumult happened at Tournay, where a Perion having bought a confiderable Quantity of Corn at the Market, was taken into Cuftody as a Monopolift. The Alarm Bell having been rung, the Populace affembled, and pillaged Five Houses; but the few Troops that were in the Town, affilled by the Bourgeois, and a Party of the Regiment of Murray, which had arrived from Mons, foon reftored Tranquillity, though not without firing upon the Infurgents, by which Five of them were killed.

A great Number of young Men having received Paffports from the Magistrates of this Town, are gone towards the Frontiers ; but this Morning Orders are issued by the Government to prohibit the Magistrates from granting any more Passports, unless to Perfons well known.
