

GENERAL POST-OFFICE, April 3, 1790. IN order to guard against the Lofs of BANK NOTES fent by the Post, it is thought necessary to repeat the Advertisement from this Office of the oth of February, 1782, by recommending it to all Perfors who may have Occasion to fend Bank Notes by the Post, to cut them in Two Parts according to the following Specimen, exactly where it is marked with a Black Line, and fend them by different Posts; first writing the Name, Date and Year at one End of the Note, and the Number and Letter at the other End; by which Means each Part will contain a sufficient Specification of the Whole, and present Difficulty in the Payment of it at the Bank of England to the right Owner, in Gase of the Loss of the other Part. other Part.
