By the KING, A PROCLAMATION, For Encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter them-

felves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War. GEO:R.G.E.R.

HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen and Landmen who shall voluntarily enter themfelves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation : And We do hereby promife and declare, That all fuch Able Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Ser-vice, who fhall; on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore, for Raifing Men for the Service of Our Navy, fhall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all fuch Ordinary Seamen, fit for "Our Service, who shall so enter themselves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man: And all fuch Able-Bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall so enter themselves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty. Such respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, residing at the Ports or Places where the Ships, into which they shall be entered, shall be, immediately after the Third Muster of such Seamen and Landmen. And We do declare, that the Qualifications of the Seamen and Landmen, fo entering themfelves as aforefaid, fhall be certified by the Captain, Mafter, and Boatfwain of the Ship or Veffel where they shall ent r. And, for Preven-tion of any Abuses, by any Persons leaving the Veffels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on Board any other Our Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty-Money, We do hereby declare and command, that fuch Seamen and Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Vef-fels, as shall ablent themselves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which they fhall belong, and shall enter themfelves on Board any other of Our staid Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid

Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or. Veffels they shall leave, but also be severely punished according to their Demerits.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Seventh Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and ninety, and in the Thirtieth Year of Our Reign.

## By the KING,

A PROCLAMATION,

For Recalling and Probibiting Seamen from jerving Foreign Princes and States, and for granting Rewards for difcovering fuch Seamen as shall conceal themsfelves.

7 HEREAS We are informed, That great Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects, are in the Service of divers.Foreign Princes and States, to the Prejudice of Our Kingdom; We have therefore thought it necelfary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation ; and do hereby ftrictly charge and command all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever and wherefoever, (being Our natural-born Subjects) who are in the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or do ferve is any Foreign Ship or Veflel, that forthwith they, and every of them, do (according to their known and bounden Duty and Allegiance) withdraw themfelves, depart from, and quit fuch Foreign Services, and return Home to their Native Countries. And farther, We do hereby strictly prohibit and forbid all Masters cf Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrgihts, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever, (being Our natural-born Subjects) from entering, and do charge and command them, and every of them, from henceforth, to forbear to enter themfelves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or to ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel whatfoever, without Our Special Licence first had and obtained in that Behalf; to all which We expect due Obe-dience and exact Conformity. And We do hereby publish and declare, that the Offenders to the contrary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Contempt according tø
