Copenhagen, September 18.

On Tuesday last their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess Royal made their Public Entry into this Capital. The Procession was extremely magnificent, and consisted of the King, the Queen Dowager, and all the different Branches of the Royal Family, together with the principal Officers of their respective Households. Their Royal Highnesses were received with the most universal Demonstrations of Joy. Various Entertainments were given at the Palace, and the Town was illuminated Three Nights successively. The Counts Schimmelman and Scheel, and Admiral Kaas were created Knights of the Order of the Elephant. The Order of Dannebrog was conferred on the Counts Frederick, Reventlau, and Baudissin; the Generals Wegner, Golz, Bulard, Castenchiold and Wachnitz, and on Mess. Buchyalt, Urne, Seckendorss, Moltke, and Wachter. And several other Gentlemen were promoted to the Ranks of Privy Councillors, Councillors of State, Councillors of Conference, and Chamberlains.
