" cife, and granting other Duties in Lieu thereof, * and for applying the faid Duties, together with * the other Duties compoling the Publick Re-" venue; for permitting the Importation of certain " Goids, Wares and Merchandize, the Produce or " Manufacture of the European Dominions of the "French King, into this Kingdom; and for ap-" plying certain unclaimed Monies remaining in the Exchequer for the Payment of Annuities on Lives " to the Reduction of the National Debt;" or by any other Laws in Force, passed subsequent to the faid Act, for that Purpole; and in Cafes where different Duties are therein imposed upon the like Goods imported from different Countries not under the Dominion of His Majesty, then upon the Payment of the lowest of fuch Duties; and fuch Goods and Merchandize shall be entitled to the same Drawbacks as are allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods and Merchandize from this Kingdom, according to the before-mentioned Tables, or by any other Laws in Force, passed subsequent to the faid Act, for that Purpofe; and fhall be liable to the fame Rules, Regulations and Refrictions as the like Goods and Merchandize are liable to upon Importation into any Port of this Kingdom, by any Laws in Force for that Purpole.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefly's Treasury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. W. Fawkener.

W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Proclamation of the 7th Day of May last, for granting Bounties for the encouraging of Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on Eoard His Majesty's Ships of War, was, fo far as respects the Bounties granted to Able and Ordinary Seamen, and Able bodied Landmen, entering themfelves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, and the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who might fecreie themfelves in this Kingdom, prolonged and extended, by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 27ch of August last, until the 31st Day of this instant October : And whereas it is expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the faid Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, by the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That the Payment of fuch Bounties to Able and Ordinary Seamen entering themselves in the Kingdom of Great Britain, to serve in His Majesty's Fleet, and also Whereof a'l Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
