A P R O C L A M A T I O N.

WESTMORLAND.

WH E R E A S by our Proclamation, bearing
 Date the 29th Day of October last, we were
 pleased to direct, that the Bounties and Rewards
 granted by our Proclamation of the 4th of August,
 1790, to all such Seamen and Landmen as should
 voluntarily enter themselves to serve on Board His
 Majesty's Fleet, should be continued to the 31st
 Day of December next inclusive: And whereas His
 Majesty, judging it no longer necessary to con-
 tinue such Bounties and Rewards, has signified unto
 us His Pleasure that we should take the necessary
 Steps for discontinuing the same forthwith; we do
 therefore hereby order and direct, that the said
 Bounties and Rewards shall from henceforth cease,
 determine, and be no longer paid or payable, any
 Thing in the said Proclamation of the 29th of Oc-
 tober last contained to the contrary notwithstanding:
 —Whereof all Persons whom it may concern
 are to take Notice, and to govern themselves ac-
 cordingly.
