News has been received here of the Fortress of Ismail having been stormed and taken by the Russian Forces, under General Suwarow, on the 22d of last Month. The Affault is faid to have lasted upwards of Seven Hours; but no authentic Particulars are yet received here of the Losses on each Side, which are reported to have been very confiderable:
