PUrfuant to an Act of Parliament paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majefly's Reign, this is to give Notice to the Concerned, that Information has been fent to this Office, That the Ship Valck, of Amfterdam, Burthen about 800 Tons, whereof G. G. Hepner was Mafter, bound on a Voyage to Batavia, lalen with Mafts, Iron, Lead and Foreign Silver Coin, on the 26th of laft Month ftruck on Happifburgh Sand, by which Accident fhe became very leaky, and by the Violence of the Sea the Mafter and Two of the Mariners were washed overboard and drowned : That on the 28th the Ship floated off the Sand, and, with the Affiftance of Two fmall Fifthing Veffels, the remaining Part of the Crew and Paffengers, with Nine Chefts (fupposed to contain Dollars and Papers) were faved and landed at Yarmouth in the County of Norfolk, and that very foon afterwards the faid Ship fell on her Beam Ends, and floated away to Sea.

Yesterday having been appointed for the Cele-bration of Her Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a numerous and fplendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Perfons of Distinction to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, before whom an Ode fet to Mufic was performed. At Three o'Clock the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrifon, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Jey throughout the City.

W Hereas it has been represented to the Commission-irs of His Majesty's Customs, that on the 10th of December last, as James Cammell, Second Mate of the Role Revenue Cultter was cruizing between Chrift-Clurch and Hurst, in a Boat belonging to the faid Gutter, he fell in with a large Smuggling Lugger near Becken Bury, and which was then landing her Cergo?
