

JAMES Martin Lloyd, Esquire, John Butcher, Thomas Sone, Siderick Elgar, William Cooper, Thomas Newiman, Charles Groome, Thomas Young, Edmund Streeter, John Batcheler, Richard Kemp, William Sharp, and Richard Jenner, having this Day presented their Petition to the House of Commons, setting forth, That by a late Resolution of a Select Committee of the House appointed to try the Merits of the Petition of Sir John Honeywood, Baronet, and John Curtis, Esquire, complaining of an undue Election and Return for the Borough of Steyning, in the County of Sussex, and which, on the Seventh Day of March, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-one, was by them reported to the House, the Right of Election of Members to serve in Parliament for the said Borough is declared to be in the "Inhabitants of ancient Houses, and Houses built on the Scites of ancient Houses within the Borough of Steyning, being Householders" paying Scot and Lot, and not receiving Alms." That the Petitioners are not satisfied with the said Resolution, and are desirous of being admitted Parties to oppose the said Right of Election, and to have the Benefit of the Statute in that Behalf made and provided.
