

## Nottinghamshire Regiment of Militia.

**H**IS Grace the Duke of Newcastle, Lord Lieutenant of the said County (in pursuance of the present Act of Parliament relating to the Militia) has ordered that the Nottinghamshire Regiment shall resort to Nottingham, on Thursday the 12th Day of May next, to be trained and exercised for the Space of Twenty-eight Days; and if any Militia Man, not labouring under any Infirmity to incapacitate him, shall not appear at the Time and Place aforesaid, such Militia Man, being convicted thereof, will incur the Penalty of Twenty Pounds, and, on Non-Payment, be liable to be committed to Goal, there to remain without Bail or Mainprize for Six Months, or until such Penalty shall have been paid.
