Corn experted," to order, and doth hereby order, That fo much of the Regulations in each and every of the faid Orders respectively contained, as were in Force and Effect until the 10th Day of June, 1791, respecting the Importation of Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Flour, Rye, Rye-Meal, Barley, Barley-Meal, Oats, Oat-Meal, Peafe and Beans respectively, or warehousing the same respectively, fhall be and continue in Force and Effect from the Day of the Date of this Order until the 15th Day of November, 1791, in like Manner, to all Intents and Purpofes, as the fame were in Force and Effect immediately before the faid 10th Day of June, 1791, unless His Majesty shall think fit, with the Advice aforefaid, to revoke the fame in Whole or in Part.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of March laft, to promife and declare, that a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, norunder the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majefty's Service, and a Bounty of Twenty Shillings to all fuch Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty and the shares in the

ie Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have been Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, " Importation and Exportation of Corn and Grain, "Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of His Majefty's Navy. And whereas His Majefty was also pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixth Day of April laft, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of May then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains and Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for the Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards should continue to be paid for some Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant June to the Thirty-first Day of July next, inclusive: Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
