A PROCLAMATION.

WESTMORLAND.

WHEREAS His Majesty hath signified unto us His Royal Pleasure, that the Parliament of this Kingdom, which now stands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifth Day of July next be further prorogued to Tuesday the Sixth Day of September next; We do therefore publish and declare, that the said Parliament be, and accordingly the said Parliament is, hereby further prorogued to Tuesday the Sixth Day of September next: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament, are to take Notice, accordingly.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice to the Public, that the New Stamp Duties on Receipts, will take Place on the 2d Day of August next; when the under-mentioned Rates are to be paid, viz.

- Two Pence, { For any Receipt, Discharge, or Acquittance, given upon the Payment of Money, amounting to 40s. and under 20.
 - Four Pence, { For Ditto, amounting to 20l. and under 50l.
 - Sixpence, { For Ditto, amounting to 50l. or upwards.
- Also for Receipts containing any general Acknowledgment of all or any Debts, Claims, Accounts or Demands, being paid; or which shall be acknowledged to be in full of all Demands.
