The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS His Majetty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty-fifth Day of March laft, to promife and declare, (amongst other Things) That a Bounty of Three Pounds should be paid to every Alle Seaman, and of Two-Pounds to every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for His Majefty's Service, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May then next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, in Manner therein ment oned; which Bounties have been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this infant July; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the faid Bounties fhould continue to be paid to fuch Able and Ordinary Seamen for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of fuch Bounties be prolonged and extended, aud that the fame do continue to be paid to every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit for His Majefty's Service, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall, on or before the Thirty first Day of August next, voluntarily enter themfeives to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Regulating Captains, or the Lieutenants employed under them, in London, or with the Captains or Lieutenants of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels of War: Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves Steph. Cottrell. accordingly.

Ministerial Notes have been delivered at St. Peterfburgh by Mr. Whitworth and Mr. Fawkener and Count Goltze, on the Part of His Majesty and of the King of Pruffia, and by Count Offerman, on the Part of the Empress of Russia, relative to the Terms of Pacification between Russia and the Porte.

In these Notes, the Ministers of His Majesty and the King of Prussia agree, on the Part of Their respective Sovereigns, that Their Majesties will propose to the Porte to conclude a Peace with Russia on the Terms of the Ceffion of the Diffrict of Oczakow, from the Bog to the Dniefter ; Her Imperial Majefty engaging not to diffurb the free Navigation of the latter River, but to favor and protect it; (to which Condition the Porte is to be equally and reciprocally bound :) And Her Imperial Majefty being also to reftore to the Porte, at the Conclusion of the Peace, all other Conquests whatever. The Minister of Her Imperial Majesty agrees, on the

Part of his Sovereign, to make Peace on these Terms; and the Ministers of His Majesty and the King of Pruffia agree, on the Part of their respective Sovereigns, that, if the Porte should decline to enter into Negociation on this Bafis, Their Majeffies will leave the Termination of the War to the Courfe of those Events to which it may lead.
