A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Twentieth Day of this Instant December; We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said Twentieth Day of this Instant December, to Tuesday the Thirty-first Day of January next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Thirty-first Day of January next, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly at Westminster, on the said Thirty-first Day of January next.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Sixteenth Day of December, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-one, in the Thirty-second Year of Our Reign.
