That, in consequence thereof, the Petitioner, Lord Hood, delivered in a Statement as "The Petitioner Lord Hood states, follows: " the Right of Election for the City and Liberty " of Westminster to be in the Inhabitants, House-"holders paying Scot and Lot, within the united Parishes of St. Margaret and St. John, and the several Parishes of St. Paul Covent Gar-"den, St. Ann, St. James, St. George Hano-"ver-square, in the Liberty of St. Martin-le-Grand " in the County of Middlefex, and in fo much of " the Parishes of St. Martin in the Fields, St. Cle-"ment Danes, and St. Mary le Strand, as are to not within any of the Four Wards of the Li-" berty of the Duchy of Lancaster, called the Temple Bar Ward, the Royal Ward, the Middle Ward, " and Precincts of the Savoy." "St. James, St. George Hanover Square, in the Liberty of St. Martin-le-Grand in the County " of Middlesex, and in so much of the Parishes of St. Martin in the Fields, St. Clement " Danes, and St. Mary le Strand, as are not within "any of the Four Wards of the Liberty of the "Duchy of Lancaster." I do hereby give Notice, that the House has appointed Wednesday the Eighteenth Day of April next, to take the faid Petition into Confideration, at the same Time that the Petition of the several Persons whose Names are thereunto subscribed, Electors of Members to ferve in Parliamen for the City and Liberty of West. minster is ordered to be taken into Consideration.
