The King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Bristol to elect a Bishop of that See, void by the Death of the Right Reverend Doctor Christopher Wilson: And His Majesty has also been pleased, by His Royal Sign Manual, to recommend the Reverend Spencer Madan, Doctor in Divinity, to be Bishop of that See.

The King has been pleased to grant to the Reverend William Cole, Master of Arts, the Dignity of a Prebend of the Collegiate Church of St. Peter, Westminster, void by the Resignation of the Reverend Doctor Thomas Jackson.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Earl of Leven to be His Majesty's High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

The King has also been pleased to appoint William Cottnam Tonge to be Clerk of the Naval or Navy Office in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia; in America.

The King has been pleased to grant to Moses Yeldham, of the City of London, Esq; His Royal Licence and Authority to take the Name of Richard, in Addition to his present Names: And also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
