Honorable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

The King has been pleafed to order a Congé d'Elire to país the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Briftol to elect a Bifhop of that See, void by the Death of the Right Reverend Doctor Chriftopher Wilfon: And His Majefty has alfo been pleafed, by His Royal Sign Manual, to recommend the Reverend Spencer Madan, Doctor in Divinity, to be Bifhop of that See.

The King has been pleafed to grant to the Reverend William Cole, Matter of Arts, the Dignity of a Prebend of the Collegiate Church of St. Peter, Westminiter, void by the Refignation of the Reverend Doctor Thomas Jackfon.

The King has been pleafed to confitute and appoint the Earl of Leven to be His Majefty's High Commiffioner to the General Affembly of the Church of Scotland.

The King has also been pleafed to appoint William Cottnam Tonge to be Clerk of the Naval or Navy Office in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia; in America.

The King has been pleafed to grant to Mofes Yeldham, of the City of London, Efq; His Royal Licence and Authority to take the Name of Richard, in Addition to his prefent Names: And alfo to order that this His Majefty's Conceffion and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning, on Thurfday next the roth Inftant, for the late King of Sweden, First Cousin to His Majesty, viz.

The Ladies to wear Black Silk, fringed or plain Linen, White Gloves, Necklaces and Earings, Black or White Shoes, Fans and Tippets.

Undrefs, White or Grey Luftrings, Tabbies or Damafks.

The Gentlemen to wear Black full trimmed, fringed or plain Linen, Black Swords and Buckles.

Undrefs, Grey Frocks.

The Court to change the Mourning on Thursday the 17th Instant, viz.

The Ladies to wear Black Silk or Velvet, coloured Ribbons, Fans and Tippets, or plain White, or White
