Exclusive of the Duty of Customs paid or payable on the IMPORTATION thereof into GREAT BRITAIN, which, by the Authority of Parliament, is directed to be deemed and taken as the Average Price of BROWN or MUSCOVADO SUGAR, for the Purpose of regulating the Allowance of the DRAWBACK on the Exportation of Sugar of the British Plantations; and the Payment of the BOUNTY on the Exportation of REFINED SUGAR, produced from Muscovado Sugar imported from His Majesty's Plantations in America.

PURSUANT to an Act of Parliament passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majesty King George the Third, and by Order of the Commissioners for managing the Duties on stamped Vellum, Parchment, and Paper, Notice is hereby given, that the Post-Masters, Innkeepers, and other Persons licensed to let Horses to travel Post, &c. residing in the Borough of Southwark, in the County of Surrey, and within Five Miles of the Head Office for Stamps, or within the Bills of Mortality, are required to attend on Monday the 30th of July instant, between the Hours of Nine in the
