**T**HE following Addresses having been transmitted to the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have been by him presented to the King: Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

**W**E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Bishop, Dean and Chapter, Archdeacons and Clergy of the Diocese of Salisbury, humbly beg Leave to express our sincere Acknowledgements for your paternal Attention to the Public Welfare, by the seasonable Interposition of Royal Authority, to counteract and repress the seditious Writings which have of late been so industriously dispersed throughout the Kingdom.

Blest with a Form of Government which cherishes Liberty as far is compatible with Order and Subordination, and under the beneficial Influence of which Great Britain has risen to an unexampled Height of Prosperity, we have observed, with Surprise and Indignation, that there exist amongst us Men so infatuated as to be insensible of the National Felicity, or so unprincipled as to endeavour to destroy it.

But such malignant Endeavours, we trust, will no longer be exerted; convinced as their Authors and Abettors must now be, that they would be exerted in vain. Your Majesty's Proclamation has been the happy Means of ascertaining and collecting the Sentiments of the great Body of the People; and while it calls forth from your Subjects of every Order and Denomination, in every Part of Kingdom, the warmest Expressions of Loyalty to your Majesty's Person, and of Attachment to the Constitution, it well becomes us, Ministers of a Church whose Interests are inseparable from those of the State, to join in the general Voice of our Fellow Citizens; and to pledge ourselves to your Majesty, that it shall be ever our Study, by a diligent and conscientious Discharge of the Duties of our Profession, to insure to Civil Government those powerful Aids that may be derived from Religion.
