

LONDON. At the General Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, at the Guildhall within the said City, on Monday the Tenth Day of September, in the Thirty-second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, King of Great Britain, &c. before John Hopkins, Esquire, Mayor of the City of London, Sir Watkin Lewes, Knt. Thomas Wright, Esquire, Aldermen of the said City, Sir John William Rose, Knight, Serjeant at Law, Recorder of the said City, Brook Watson, Esquire, Thomas Skinner, Esquire, Sir Richard Carr Glyn, Knight, other of the Aldermen of the said City, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lord the King, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lord the King within the said City, and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespasses and other Misdemeanors committed within the said City;
