
GENERAL POST-OFFICE, September 22, 1792.

TO prevent the Loss of entire Notes or Drafts, payable to Bearer, in Letters put into any Post-Office of Receiving-House, the Postmaster-General repeat the Recommendation, so often inserted in the London Gazettes, and circulated by Hand-Bills throughout the Kingdom; namely, to cut all such Notes or Drafts in half in the following Form, to send them at Two different Times, and to wait for the Return of the Post till the Receipt of One Half is acknowledged before the other is sent.

And, when any Cash, in Gold or Silver, or when any Rings or Lockets, &c. are fent per Post from London, particular Care should be taken to deliver the same to the Clerk at the Window, or to the Clerk of the Money-Book, at the General Post-Office; and, when any fuch Letter is to be sent from a Gountry Post-Office, it should be delivered into the Hands of the Postmaster.

N. B. The Note is to be cut exactly where it is marked with a Black Line, first writing the Date and Year at one End of the Note, and the Number at the other End, by which Means each Part will contain a sufficient Specification of the Whole.

This Specimen will be put up at every Post-Office in the Kingdom.
