And, when any Cash, in Gold or Silver, or when any Rings or Lockets, &: are sent per Post from London, particular Care should be taken to deliver the same to the terk at the Window, or to the Clerk of the Money-Book, at the General Post-Office; and, when any such Letter is to be sent from a Country Post-Office, it should be delivered into the Hands of the Postmaster:
