AT the Court at St. James's, the 9th of November,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. IS Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Person or Persons whatever shall, from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, until the 1st Day of March, 1793, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or cause or procure to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed, out of or from any Port or Place in Great Britain, or load or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be loaded or laid on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Wheat or Wheat Flour .-- His . Majesty nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath shought fit to order, and doth hereby order, that nothing herein contained shall, extend, or be confirued to extend, to prohibit the Exportation of any Foreign Wheat or Wheat Flour, which shall have been imported into this Kingdom, and warehoused in the Manner and upon the Conditions mentioned in an Act passed in the Thirty-sirst Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, . An Act for reguec lating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, ee and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn es imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exa ported;" nor to prohibit the carrying Coastwife,

Wheat Flour, in the Manner and in the same Propertions and Quantities, and from and to the same Ports and Places, as is by the said Ast allowed, at such Times as Wheat and Wheat Flour are prohibited to be exported, by reason of the Price of Wheat and Wheat Flour being at or above the Prices mentioned in Table B. in the said Ast contained, subject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Restrictions, Forseitures and Penaltics, as are required and imposed by the said Ast, or by any other Ast now in Force, in any of the Cases aforesaid.

—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
