Veffels, as shall absent themselves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which they shall belong, and shall enter themselves on Board any other of Our faid Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave, but also be punished according to their Demerits.

Given at Our Court at Windfor, the First Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-two, and in the Thirty-third Year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. T I.S. Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hath thought fit to order; and it is hereby ordered, that no Ferfon or Perfons whatever shall, from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, until the 1st Day of March, 1793, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or caule or procure to be exported; tranfported, carried or conveyed, out of or from any Port or Place in Great Britain, or load or lay on Board, or caufe or procure to be loaded or laid on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made of Barley, Beer or Bigg : His Majefty neverthelefs, by the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit to order, and doth hereby order, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prohibit the Exportation of any Foreign Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Meal, Flour; Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made of Barley, Beer or Bigg, which shall have been imported into this Kingdom, and warehoused in the Manner and upon the Conditions mentioned in an Act paffed in the Thirtyfirst Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An " Act for regulating the Importation and Exporta-" tion of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on " Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on " British Corn exported ;" nor to prohibit the carrying Coastwile, or the carrying out and exporting of Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made of Barley, Beer or Bigg, in the Manner and in the fame Proportions and Quantities, and from and to the fame Ports and Places, as is by the faid Act allowed, at fuch Times as Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made of Barley, Beer or Bigg, are prohibited to be exported, by Reafon of the Price of Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Meal, Flour; Malt, Bread or Biscuit made of Barley, Beer or Bigg, being at or above the

Prices mentioned in Table B. in the faid Act contained, fubject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Refirictions, Forfeitures and Penalties as are required and imposed by the faid Act, or by any other AC now in Force, in any of the Cafes aforefaid: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

WHereas an A& of Parliament was passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the second, intituled, " An Act to impower His Majelly to prohibit " the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majesty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any " Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and alfo to " impower His Majefty to reffrain the carrying "Coaffwile of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any " Sort of Arms or Ammunition :" And His Majefty, judging it necessary to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, out of this Kingdom, or carrying the fame Coastwife, for fome Time, doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfocver (except the Master General of the Ordnance, for this Majefty's Service) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order in Council, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Soft of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by the aforementioned Act! And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertains
