The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act passed in the present Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act of for establishing Regulations respecting, Aliens ar-" riving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in " certain Cases," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to order and direct such Aliens, as are therein mentioned, to dwell and reside respectively in such Difiricts as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall think necessary for the Public Security; His Majesty, by the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby order and direct that all Aliens, who shall have arrived within this Kingdom fince the First Day of January, 1792, or who shall arrive therein during the Continuance of the aforefaid Act, or until His Majesty's Royal Will and Pleasure respecting such Aliens shall be further expressed, (other than Aliens being Alien Merchants, according to the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act, and Domestic Servants of any of the natural-born Subjects of His Majesty, of of Subjects to whom Letters Patent of Denization have been or shall be hereafter granted, or the Domestic Servants of any of His Majesty's Subjects who now are or shall be hereafter naturalized by Act of Parliament, fuch Domestic Servants being actually and bona fide employed in the Service of their respective Masters, and other than such Aliens as shall, by virtue of a Special Licence, under the Hand and Seal of One of His Majefly's Principal Secretaries of State, be authorized to divell and refide, during the Time that such Licence shall be in Force, in other Parts of this King-

after the Fifteenth Day of February, 1793, if such Aliens shall then be resident in England, or if such -Aliens shall be resident in Scotland, then from and after the Twentieth Day of February, 1793, dwell or reside only within the Limits of the Weekly Bills of Mortality, or within the Parishes of St. Mary le Bone, Paddington, Pancras, and St. Luke at Chelfea in the County of Middlesex, or within such Parts of the Kingdom as shall not be more than Fifty Miles from the Standard in Cornbill, and not less than Ten Miles distant from the Sea Coast, and also from any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards; and in no other Parts whatever: Provided that this Order shall not be construed to extend to such Aliens as shall land in any Part of this Kingdom, in which Aliens are not, or shall not be, prohibited from landing by His Majesty's Proclamation or Order in Council, and who shall be actually proceeding to the Collector, Comptroller, or other Chief Officer of the Customs at fuch Port, for the Purpose of making the Declaration, and receiving the Certificate by the faid Act required; or proceeding to the Mayor or other Chief Magistrate at such Port, for the Purpose of obtaining his or her Passport, as by the said Act is also required; for to any Alien who shall have made such Declaration, and shall have obtained such Certificate and Passport as before mentioned, and shall be actually and bona fide proceeding on his or her Journey to some Place of Residence being within those Parts of Great Britain in which, pursuant to this Order, fuch Alien may dwell and refide; nor to any Alien. Who shall be proceeding on his or her Journey to the Sea Coult of this Kingdom with fuch Passports as are by the faid Act required, in order to embark

for Foreign Parts; nor to any Mariner who shall be on Shore in the Port of his Arrival, and whom the Master or Commander of the Ship or Vessel in which such Mariner shall have arrived, shall have certified to the Collector, Comptroller or other Chief Officer of the Customs, in Writing, subscribed by such Master, to be actually engaged and employed in the Navigation of such Ship or Vessel: His Majesty doth hereby charge and command that all Aliens to whom this Order relates, shall pay due Obedience to the same; and that all Justices of the Peace, Mayors and other Magistrates do respectively use their utmost Diligence to ensorce the same.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS His Majesty has received Intelligence that some Ships belonging to His "Majesty's Subjects have been and are detained in the French Ports; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleafed to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no Ships or Vestels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of France, or for the Ports of any Country occupied by the Armies of France, until further Order: And His Majesty is further pleased to order, that a General Embargo or Stop be made of all French Ships and Vessels whatfoever now within, or which hereafter shall come into any of the Ports, Harbours or Roads within the Kingdom of Great Britain, together with all Persons and Effects on Board the faid Ships and Vessels; but that the utmost Care be taken for the Preservation of all and every Part of the Cargoes on Board any of the faid Ships, fo that no Damage or Embezzlement whatever be fustained: - And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. It is this Day ordered, by His Majesty in Council, that all Packet-Boats and Bye-Boats, whether British or French, employed in the Conveyance of Letters and Passengers between this Country and France, or the Countries occupied by the Armies of France, be permitted to pass and repass, as heretofore, with their respective Complements of Men, and that such French Packets or Bye-Boats as may now be within any of the Ports, Harbours or Roads of this Kingdom, into which it has been usual for

fuch French Packets or Bye-Boats to come, be not detained, notwithstanding any Thing contained in His Majesty's Order in Council, of the 4th of this Instant February, for preventing Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of France, or for the Ports of any Country occupied by the Armies of France, and for stopping all French Ships and Veffels whatever now within, or which shall hereafter come into, any of the Ports, Harbours or Roads within the Kingdom of Great Britain, together with all Persons and Effects on Board the said Ships and Vessels. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THEREAS by an Act, passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act " to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation " of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent " the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammu-" nition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order " in Council," it is enacted, amongst other Things, that His Majesty may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, when he shall see Cause, and for such Time as shall be therein expressed, prohibit the exporting, or the attempting to export, Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet Copper, and other Naval Stores: And His Majesty, judging it necessary to prohibit the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles for a limited Time, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatfoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order in Council, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet Copper, or other Naval Stores; or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet Copper, or other Naval Stores, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted

by the aforementioned Act & But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships, or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, er by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coasts of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coasts of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same, to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: - And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

An Act for regulating the Allowance of the

"Drawback and Payment of the Bounty on the Ex-" portation of Sugar and Coffee into the Bahama " and Bermuda Islands in Foreign Ships," His Majesty was pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 15th of June, 1792, to approve of the Port of Exuma, in the Island of Exuma, one of the faid Bahama Islands, and of the Port of St. George and the Port of Pembroke, in the faid Island of Bermuda, to be Ports for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, fubject to the Regulations prescribed in the Acts of the Twenty-seventh and Thirtieth Years of His Majesty's Reign, mentioned in the said Order in Council: And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that it will better answer the Purposes of the said Act, that the Port of Hamilton, in the Harbour of Crow Lane, in the faid Island of Bermuda, should be approved as the Port for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, instead of Penibroke, mentioned in the said Order. His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby to revoke and make void fo nuch of the afore recited Order as approved of the Port of Pembroke (therein mentioned) for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation. And His Majesty is further pleafed, with the Advice aforefaid, to approve of the Port of Hamilton, in the Harbour of Crow Liane; in the Island of Bermuda, to be a Port for the Importation of Sugar and Coffee, the Produce of any Foreign Country or Plantation, subject to the Regulations prescribed in the Two Acts last mentioned in the afore recited Order in Council &f the 15th Day of June, 1792.
