AT the Court at the *Queen's House*, the 11th of February, 1793,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS divers injurious Proceedings have lately been had in France in derogation of the Honour of His Majesty's Crown, and of the just Rights of His Subjects: And whereas several unjust Seizures have been there made of the Ships and Goods of His Majesty's Subjects, contrary to the Law of Nations, and to the Faith of Treaties: And whereas the said Acts of unprovoked Hostility have been followed by an open Declaration of War against His Majesty, and His Ally the Republick of the United Provinces; His Majesty, therefore, being determined to take such Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honour of His Crown, and for procuring Reparation and Satisfaction for His injured Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprizals be granted against the Ships, Goods and Subjects of France, so that as well His Majesty's Fleet and Ships, as also all other Ships and Vessels that shall be commissioned by Letters of Marque or General Reprizals, or otherwise, by His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully seize all Ships, Vessels and Goods belonging to France, or to any Persons being Subjects of France, or inhabiting within any of the Territories of France, and bring the same

to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions; and to that End His Majesty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorizing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Person or Persons by them empowered and appointed, to issue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprizal to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others whom the said Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, seizing and taking the Ships, Vessels and Goods belonging to France, or to any Persons being Subjects of France, or inhabiting within any of the Territories of France; and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual and are according to former Precedents: And His Majesty's said Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorizing the said Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the said Court, his Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the several Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon, all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be taken, and

and to hear and determine the same, and according to the Course of Admiralty, and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all such Ships, Vessels and Goods as shall belong to France, or to any Persons being Subjects of France, or inhabiting within any of the Territories of France; and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents: And they are likewise to prepare, and lay before His Majesty at this Board, a Draught of such Instructions as may be proper to be sent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's Foreign Governments and Plantations, for their Guidance herein; as also another Draught of Instructions for such Ships as shall be commissioned for the Purposes aforementioned. WHEREAS His Majesty has received Intelligence that some Ships belonging to His Majesty's Subjects have been and are detained in the French Ports; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of France, or for the Ports of any Country occupied by the Armies of France, until further Order: And His Majesty is further pleased to order, that a General Embargo or Stop be made of all French Ships and Vessels whatsoever now within, or which hereafter shall come into any of the Ports, Harbours or Roads within the Kingdom of Great Britain, together with all Persons and Effects on Board the said Ships and Vessels; but that the utmost Care be taken for the Preservation of all and every Part of the Cargoes on Board any of the said Ships, so that no Damage or Embezzlement whatever be sustained: — And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT is this Day ordered, by His Majesty in Council, that all Packet-Boats and Bye-Boats, whether British or French, employed in the Conveyance of Letters and Passengers between this Country and France, or the Countries occupied by the Armies of France, be permitted to pass and repass, as heretofore, with their respective Complements of Men, and that such French Packets or Bye-Boats as may now be within any of the Ports, Harbours or Roads of this Kingdom, into which it has been usual for such French Packets or Bye-Boats to come, be not detained, notwithstanding any Thing contained in His Majesty's Order in Council, of the 4th of this Instant February, for preventing Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of France, or for the Ports of any Country occupied by the Armies of France, and for stopping all French Ships and Vessels whatever now within, or which shall hereafter come into, any of the Ports, Harbours or Roads within the Kingdom of Great Britain, together with all Persons and Effects on Board the said Ships and Vessels. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to order and direct such Aliens, as are therein mentioned, to dwell and reside respectively in such Districts as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall think necessary for the Public Security; His Majesty, by the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby order and direct that all Aliens, who shall have arrived within this Kingdom since the First Day of January, 1792, or who shall arrive therein during the Continuance of the aforesaid Act, or until His Majesty's Royal Will and Pleasure respecting such Aliens shall be further expressed, (other than Aliens being Alien Merchants, according to the true Intent and

Meaning

Meaning of the said Act, and Domestic Servants of any of the natural-born Subjects of His Majesty, or of Subjects to whom Letters Patent of Denization have been or shall be hereafter granted, or the Domestic Servants of any of His Majesty's Subjects who now are or shall be hereafter naturalized by Act of Parliament, such Domestic Servants being actually and bona fide employed in the Service of their respective Masters, and other than such Aliens as shall, by virtue of a Special Licence, under the Hand and Seal of One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, be authorized to dwell and reside, during the Time that such Licence shall be in Force, in other Parts of this Kingdom than those hereinafter (specified) shall, from and after the Fifteenth Day of February, 1793, if such Aliens shall then be resident in England, or if such Aliens shall be resident in Scotland, then from and after the Twentieth Day of February, 1793, dwell or reside only within the Limits of the Weekly Bills of Mortality, or within the Parishes of *St. Mary le Bone, Paddington, Pancras, and St. Luke at Chelsea* in the County of *Middlesex*, or within such Parts of the Kingdom as shall not be more than Fifty Miles from the Standard in *Cornhill*, and not less than Ten Miles distant from the Sea Coast, and also from any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards; and in no other Parts whatever: Provided that this Order shall not be construed to extend to such Aliens as shall land in any Part of this Kingdom, in which Aliens are not, or shall not be, prohibited from landing by His Majesty's Proclamation or Order in Council, and who shall be actually proceeding to the Collector, Comptroller, or other Chief Officer of the Customs at such Port, for the Purpose of making the Declaration, and receiving the Certificate by the said Act required; or proceeding to the Mayor or other Chief Magistrate at such Port, for the Purpose of obtaining his or her Passport; as by the said Act is also required; nor to any Alien who shall have made such Declaration, and shall have obtained such Certificate and Passport as before mentioned, and shall be actually and bona fide proceeding on his or her Journey to some Place of Residence being within those Parts of Great Britain in which, pursuant to this Order, such Alien may dwell and reside; nor to any Alien who shall be proceeding on his or her Journey to the Sea Coast of this Kingdom with such Passports as are by the said Act required, in order to embark for Foreign Parts; nor to any Mariner who shall be on Shore in the Port of his Arrival, and whom the Master or Commander of the Ship or Vessel in which such Mariner shall have arrived, shall have certified to the Collector, Comptroller or other Chief Officer of the Customs, in Writing, subscribed by such Master, to be actually engaged and employed in the Navigation of such Ship or Vessel: His Majesty doth

hereby charge and command that all Aliens to whom this Order relates, shall pay due Obedience to the same; and that all Justices of the Peace, Mayors and other Magistrates do respectively use their utmost Diligence to enforce the same.
