Stamp-Office, Somerfet-Place, Feb. 12, 1793.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties think it proper, on the near Approach of the Drawing of the Lottery, to give this Publick Notice, that the following Regulations are established by this Office, for preventing ILLEGAL INSURANCE: 1st. Pursuant to a Settlement with the Committee of

City Lands, no Perfon will be admitted at Guildball to take down the Numbers as they are drawn but the Clerks of the licenfed Lotiery-Office-Keepers. 2d. The Numbers are to be taken by the faid Gerks,

not, as before, on separate Slips, but in the Numerical Book of each Office, figned by the respective Office-Keepers, and counter-figned by Two or more of the Commillioners of Stamps.

3d. No Account of any Part of the Drawing in each Day is to be iffued, nor any of the Clerks to return with their Numerical Books, until the final Clofe of each Day's Drawing.

4th. By a Settlement with Mr. Steele, the Proprietor of the Patent Lift, the fame is not to be published, as beretofore, by Slips, in each Hour, nor by an early Ac-count of the Drawing of each Day, (both of which Com-munications obvioully contributed to the Abujes of illegal Infurance;) but in future only Twice a Week, for the necefary Information of the Publich at large, and at fuch Hours as the Intelligence can be least perverted for the Abufes of unlicenfed Offices, if any juch shall remain. But the Commiffioners truft, that, by these Regulations, and by the published Notices from the Lord Mayor and the Court of Aldermen, as well as from the Chairman and the Magistrates for Westminster and the County of Middlefex; and like wife from the Magistrates of the Police, of a perfect Co-operation with this Office, the only remaining Abuse that has attached on the State Lotteries will be as totally suppressed as the Sale of The illegal Chances, which is completely at an End. injuperable Difficulties that are now opposed to the illegal Transactions, cannot fail to discourage the Continuance of unlicenfed Offices; and the Evidence of the Publick, that if any juch should be continued, they must proceed without antibentick Intelligence of the Drawings, cannot but prevent, to a great Degree, further Confidence. being repojed in the illicit Dealers; who, on their Part, by perfifting in illegal Attempts, can only expose themfelves, for diminified Profits, to the increased Vigilance of the Magistracy in the effectual Maintenance of the Law.
