the Place for which fuch Ships and Veffels shall be entered and cleared out; and do give Security by Bond, in Treble the Value of the Articles fo exported, to the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port at which fuch Ships and Veffels shall enter and clear out, with Two other able and fufficient Sureties (of whom the Master of the Ship shall be One) to be approved of by the faid Officers of the Cuftoms, to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of fuch Bond, from the proper Officer of the Cuftoms of the Port to which fuch Ships or Veffels shall go, or, in case fuch Ships or Vessels shall go to a Port where there is no fuch Officer, then from the British Conful refident at fuch Port, or, in cafe there fhall be no fuch Conful there refident, or he fhall be absent from the fame, then from Two British Merchants refident there, Certificates of their having. delivered the Articles above enumerated at the Places for which they have been entered ; and no fuch Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up, but on the Production of fuch Certificates :- And it is His Majesty's further Pleafure, that the faid Embargo shall not extend to any Ship or Vessel belonging to the Subjects of Countries in Amity with His Majefty, laden with Leather manufactured; provided that the Merchant Exporter do make Oath of the due Deftination of the Ship or Veffel to the Port for which flie shall be entered and cleared out, and do give the like Security, with Two other able and fufficient Sureties, being known British Merchants, or other Perfons of acknowledged Credit, refident in this Kingdom, to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of fuch Bond, from the proper Officer of the Cuftoms of the Port to which fuch Ships or Veffels shall go, or, in cafe fuch Ships or Veffels shall go to a Port where there is no fuch Officer, then from the British Conful refident at fuch Port, or, in case there fhall be no fuch Conful there refident, or he fhall be ablent from the fame, then from Two British Merchants refident there, Certificates of their having delivered fuch manufactured Leather at the Place for which it shall have been entered; and no such Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up but on the Production of fuch Certificates : - And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Ad. miralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

PROCLAMATION

FOR

PARDONING DESERTERS. War-Office, February 26, 1793.

HEREAS it has been reprefented to the King, that there are at this Time feveral Deferters from the different Regular Corps in His Majefty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Pardon; and that fuch an Inflance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour; His Majefty has been gracioufly pleafed, by His Order in Council, to grant His free Pardon to all Deferters from His Regular Land Forces, who shall furrender themselves, on or before the 30th of April pext, to the Corps from which they originally deferted; but if fuch Corps be not within this Kingdom, they shall then be entitled to the like Pardon, on Condition of furrendering to any other Regular Corps in His Majefty's Land Service, or to any Recruising Party thereof in Great Britain or Ireland.

Such Deferters, if Able-bodied Men and fit for Service, fhall be atteffed in the Corps to which they furrender, and not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged, unlefs it fhall appear that fuch other Corps, or fome Part thereof, was actually in Great Britainat the Time of their furrendering.

And whereas many of the faid Deferters may have enlifted in other Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon, and to direct, that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, without being under the Necessity of declaring themfelves Deferters in order to entitle. them to the Benefit of this Pardon ; and they shall not be liable, at any future. Time to be claimed by that in which they formerly ferved ; Deferters from, the Royal Regiment of Artillery, or Corps of Royal Military Artificers and Labourers excepted ; who, if, ferving in other Corps, are only, to be entitled to. the Benefit of this Pardon upon Condition of declaring themfelves Deferters from, and of returning to, the Corps under the Department of the Ordnance :: to which they originally belonged; and, not fo declaring themfelves, they shall be liable at any future. Time to be claimed by the faid Corps, and punished. as Deferters.

And whereas feveral of the faid Deferters have, been apprehended and are now in Gaol, or in Regimental Cuftody, His Majesty is likewise pleased to grant them His free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit upon their Arrival at their own Corps, or upon their being enlisted by fome other Corps or Recruiting Party, according as their respective Cafes may be, and in Conformity to the Conditions herein before fet forth.

Any Soldier, who may have deferted fince the First of this inflant February, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.

By His Majefty's Command, G. E. O., Y. O. N. G. E. 2
