

to fulfil the Treaties, because we considered your Majesty's Declaration to be honourable, just and politic; but when the unprincipled Rulers of France attempted to persuade the British Nation that the Cause of the King of England was not the Cause of the People of England, and a Declaration of War on their Part rendered the Exertion of the whole Force of Great Britain indispensable, your Majesty's loyal Subjects in this County solicited and obtained your Majesty's Permission to unite their private Exertions and Bounties towards completing the Naval Service.

We congratulate your Majesty on the late Successes; and we trust that the same Wisdom which directed the well-timed Assistance to Holland, will, by the Blessing of the Almighty, direct also the Valor and Zeal of your Majesty's Armies and Navies in a Career of similar Success, to an honourable Termination of the Calamities of War.

We beg Leave to offer our grateful Acknowledgements for the late Instances of your Royal Protection, personal to us as Inhabitants of this County, for the Facility of Intercourse with all Parts of Great Britain and Ireland, by late Establishments, and also for your Majesty's gracious Attention to the Improvement of this Coast, by Measures calculated to promote Naval Adventure, the Completion of which we anxiously hope for, that the Exertions of this County, on every future Emergency, may be more equal to the Expression of its Loyalty and Attachment to your Majesty.
