

Vienna, April 20.

Her Imperial Majesty was Yesterday delivered of a Prince, who was this Day baptized by the Names of Ferdinand, Charles, Leopold, Joseph, Francis, Marcellin. His Sicilian Majesty, represented by his Ambassador the Marquis of Gallo, was the sole Sponsor. After the Ceremony there was a Court, when the Nobility and Foreign Ministers had the Honor to pay their Respects to the Emperor, and to congratulate His Imperial Majesty on the Birth of an Heir.

And, as a further Encouragement, His Majesty is hereby pleased to promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person (except as before excepted) who shall make such Discovery as aforesaid; to be paid by the Right Hon. the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of One or more of the Offenders.
