WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclama ion bearing Place the I'wenty-fixth Day of December last, to promile and declare, that the Boonties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His His Majelly's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majetty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majelly's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also gracioully pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Maj sty's Royal Bounty: And whereas the Time i ereby limited was, by Order in Council, prolonged and extended from the faid Twenty-eighth Day of February to the Thirtieth Day of this instant April: And whereas His Majetty was also graciously . pleafed, by HisRoyal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February last, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be haid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majetty's Service on or before the Thirtieth Day of this inflant April, by any of His Majesty's Sua Officers appointed to raise Men

on Shore, or i y the Captains and Commanders of any f His M jeffy' Ships or Veffels in the Ports, or on he Coulls of this Kirgdom: And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties' and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant April to the Thirtieth Day of June next, inclusive: Whereof ill Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtyfirst Year of His present Majesty's Reign, inticuled, " An Act for indemnifying all Persons " who have been concerned in advising or carrying " into execution a certain Order of Council re-. freeling the Importation of a limited Quantity " of Salt Petre; for repealing the Duties now ' payable upon the Importation of Salt Petre; " and for granting other Duties in lieu thereof;" it was, amongst other Things, enacted, that the United Company of Merchants trading to the East Indies should, and they were thereby required, Half yearly, at each of their Publick Sales, to put up Five Thousand Bags of Salt Petre more than should appear, upon an Average taken of the Four last preceding Sales, to have been fold by the faid United Company at each of the faid Sales, at the Price of Thirty one Shillings per Hundred Weight, and not higher, in Time of Peace, and at the Price of Forty Shillings per Hundred Weight, and not higher, in Time of War or Publick Hollility; and that the Refraction of such Salt Petre so put up should not exceed on an Average Five Pounds in every One Hundred and Twelve Pounds of fuch Salt Petre; and that in case the said United Company should not, as before directed, declare, within Fourteen Days before each Publick Sale, their Intention to put up, or in case they should not, at each Publick Sale, put up the before mentioned Quantity of such Salt Petre, at the before mentioned Prices respectively, it should and might be lawful for His Majetty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit the Importation from any Foreign Country of the Whole of the faid Quantity of Salt Petre, or of so much thereof, as
