Tards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles before mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, (except for the Purpofes and to the Places mentioned in the faid Order ;) which Order was, by another Order dated the Twenty-fourth Day of July last, continued for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Twenty-fifth of the faid Month of July. And whereas it hath been reprefented, on Behalf sof the principal Importers and Venders of Bar-Iron in the City of London, that great Lofs and Inconvenience will refult to the Trade, by the Exportation of Bar-Iron continuing to be prohibited to Countries in Amity with His Majefty, without fpecial Orders being obtained for that Purpose : His Majesty, taking the fame into Confideration, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, (as it is hereby ordered) That from and after the Date hereof, the Exportation of Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron shall, notwithftanding the faid Orders, be permitted and allowed from any of the Ports of this Kingdom to any Country, in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty, in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; provided the Merchant Exporter of any fuch Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron do first make Oath of the true Deftination of the same to the Places for which fuch Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other; and to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the British Conful refident at the Port for which fuch Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron shall be cleared out, or, in

or he shall be absent from the fame, then from Two British Merchants refident there, a Certificate or Certificates that fuch Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron has been all duly delivered at the Ports for which the fame was cleared out; and the Bonds or Securities shall not be cancelled or delivered up but on the Production of fuch Certificate or Certificates.
