Penrice and Norbury, in Droitwich aforesaid, to receive the Signatures of such of the said Creditors who wish to take the Benefit thereof: And all Persons indebted to the said Samuel Bedford are hereby required to pay their respective Debts immediately to the said Assignees, or to the said Mess. Penrice and Norbury, who are properly authorized to receive the same.

WHEREAS Dorothy Smith, late of Mile-End Old Town, in the County of Middlesex and Kingdom of England, Spinster, deceased, by her last Will and Testament bearing Date the 25th Day of January 1790, bequeathed to Martin Smith, Nephew of her late Father, 2000 l. 3 per Cent. Bank Annuities of the Year 1726, besides the Legacy left him by her late Father, for his Life, and then to go to the Heirs of his Body, Share and Share equally alike; and she desired her Executors to advertize for him or his Heirs Five Times in the New York Gazette: And in case the said Martin Smith was not heard of in Two Years after the said Testatrix's Decease, she then disposed of the said Sum as follows: The 2000 l. lawful Money left him by her late Father, she willed and desired her Executors to pay to the Guardians of the Asylum for Orphan Girls, at the Expiration of the before mentioned Term, if he or they are not heard of. She also desired her Executors to pay, out of the 2000 l. 3 per Cents. bequeathed to the said Martin Smith and his Heirs, in case of their not being heard of in the Time appointed, the Sum of 500 l. 3 per Cents. to the Governors of the Lying-in Hospital for Married Women; also 500 l. 3 per Cents. to the Charity for the Relief of Poor Blind Persons; also 500 l. 3 per Cents. to the Governors of St. Luke's Hospital; and 500 l. 3 per Cents. to the Governors of the London Hospital; which Sums to be duly paid by her Executors within Two Months after the Two Years before-mentioned, if he the said Martin Smith, or his Heirs, be not heard of in that Time; but should there be any Heir or Heirs of the Body of the said Martin Smith, then these Legacies to be void. And whereas the said Dorothy Smith departed this Life on the 13th Day of May 1792: Now the said Martin Smith, or the Heirs of his Body if there are any, are directed to apply to William Bridges, of the Bank of England, Gentleman, or to Gale Middleton, of Leadenball-Street, London, in the Kingdom of England, Warehouseman, and to claim the said Legacy within Two Years from the 13th Day of May 1792, otherwise the same will, at the Expiration of the said Two Years, be disposed of, pursuant to the Directions of the Will of the said Dorothy Smith, in Exclusion of the said Martin Smith and the Heirs of his Body. The said Martin Smith was the Son of Richard and Susannah Smith, and born in the Parish of St. Thomas Southwark in the Year 1749. He was put Apprentice to Thomas Bennett, of Redcross-Street in the Park, Southwark, Cooper; in the Year 1766 or 1767 he went to America, and afterwards lived at Robert Alexander's Plantation in Augusta County, Virginia: The last Advice his Friends in England received from him was, that he then lived with Mr. David Lard, Merchant and Store-keeper, near Stent Town in Augusta County aforesaid. About Eleven or Twelve Years ago his Friends were informed, by a young Man, that he had seen him at Long Island, and that he told him he resided at New York, near Canvass Town, and carried on the Trade of a Cooper there. His Mother is now living in London.

Whoever will give Information to the said Mr. Bridges or Mr. Middleton, the Executors of the said Dorothy Smith, if the said Martin Smith, or any Heir of his Body, is living, and at what Place, or that he and his Issue are dead, and can bring sufficient Proof thereof, shall be handsomely rewarded for their Trouble.

SUCH of the Creditors (if any) of Mr. James Lowe, late of Darland Hall in Denbighshire, afterwards of Congleton in Cheshire, as have not sent an Account of their Debts to Mess. Garfide and Wilkinfon, of Congleton, Mr. Lowe's Assignees, are requested so to do immediately, or they will be excluded the Benefit of the Dividend, which appears to be, from the present Statement,
