WE, His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties, duly authorized by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to Act of Parliament, to let to Farm the Duties granted by "An Act of the 25th of His present Majesty on "Horses let to Hire for travelling Post and by "Times," do hereby give Notice, that we intend to let, at our Office in Somerset-Place, the said Duties to Farm, on Tuesday the 7th Day of January next, between the Hours of Ten and Twelve in the Forenoon, according to the Districts in the Statement undermentioned, and to put the same up at the Sums placed opposite to each, for the Term of Three Years from the 1st Day of February next, to such Persons as may be willing to contract for the same. All Persons intending to farm the said Duties are to deliver in their Proposals to us, at the Stamp-Office in Somerset-Place, at least Three Days previous to the said 7th Day of January next, signed with their Names, stating the Places of their Abode, and specifying the District for which they intend to bid, or their Proposals cannot be proceeded on, as directed by the said Act.

No Persons licensed to let Horses for the Purpose of travelling Post, nor any Persons for their Use, can be admitted to contract for the said Duties.
