ISLAND of St. EUSTATIUS.

THE great Variety of Claims for Restitution of Property seized in February, 1781, at the Capture of the said Island and its Dependencies, being at length adjusted, the Agents for the Fleet and Army employed on that Service hereby give Notice, that they will distribute 64,000*l.* to the Persons entitled to share therein, or their legal Representatives; which Sum is nearly the Amount of what is at this Time in their Hands, reserving only a Fund for discharge of Law and other Expenses still remaining unjustified.

The said Sum will be divided in the Proportions prescribed by His Majesty's Instructions of the 30th of March, 1781, and the Order in Council dated the 17th of July, 1793, before which last mentioned Date no Distribution could possibly take Place.

The Proportions are as follows, viz.

Two Sixteenths to the Commanders in Chief by Sea and Land, to whose prompt and vigorous Executions in the Execution of their Orders, the Capture was ascribed, (the usual Proportion allotted to them being judged by His Majesty too small;) and the subsequent Allotments out of the remaining Fourteen Sixteenths as hereafter mentioned, viz.

One Sixteenth to the Commanders in Chief.

One Ditto to the Flag and General Officers.

Four Ditto to the Captains of the Navy and Field Officers.

Two Ditto to the Lieutenants of the Navy, Captains of the Army and Marines.

Two Ditto to the Warrant Officers of the Navy, Subalterns of the Army and Marines.

Two Ditto to the Petty Officers of the Navy, Non-Commissioned Officers of the Army, and Marines.

Four Ditto to the Sailors, Soldiers and Marines.
