Dominion of His Majefty, according to the Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to an Act passed in the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for repealing the " feveral Duties of Cuftoms and Excife, and grant-" ing other Duties in Lieu thereof, and for apply-" ing the faid Duties together with the other Du-" ties composing the Public Revenue; for permit-" ting the Importation of certain Goods, Wares " and Merchandize, the Produce or Manufacture " of the European Dominions of the French King, " into this Kingdom; and for applying certain un-" claimed Monies remaining in the Exchequer, for " the Payment of Annuities on Lives, to the Re-" duction of the National Debt;" or by any other Laws in Force paffed subsequent to the faid Act, touching the Duties contained in the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F.; and in Cafes where different Duties are imposed upon the like Goods imported from different Countries not under the Dominion of His Majesty, then that such Goods fhall be imported upon the lowest Duties which by the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. are required to be paid on the Importation of any fuch Goods from any European Country not under the Dominion of His Majefty.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that all fuch Goods and Merchandize shall be intitled to the fame Drawbacks as are allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods and Merchandize when exported from this Kingdom, according to the faid Schedule and Tables, marked A. D. and F. annexed to the before mentioned Act paffed in the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent Majelty's Reign, or according to any other Law in Force, paffed subsequent to the faid Act, touching And it is hereby further ordered, Drawbacks. that there shall be allowed and paid the same Drawbacks and Bounties on Goods and Merchandize exported from this Kingdom to the Territories of the faid United States, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Islands, Plantations, or Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America. And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be allowed and paid the fame Drawbacks upon the Exportation of any Sort of Foreign Hemp or Foreign Iron exported from this Kingdom into any British Colony or Plantation in America, or into the Territories of the United States of America, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Sort of Hemp or Iron to other Foreign Parts; and all fuch Drawbacks and Bounties respectively shall be allowed and paid in the fame Manner, and under the fame

Rules, Regulations, Refitictions and Forfeitures, in all Refpects, as fuch Drawbacks and Bounties are allowed and paid, or are fubject and liable to by Law.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may be imported in British or American Ships, owned and navigated as herein before required, upon Payment of the fame Duties as Tobacco, imported by British Subjects from any British Colony or Plantation, is or may hereafter be fubject to; and that any Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of any of the faid Territories, may be imported in Manner before mentioned, upon Payment of fuch Duties as Snuff, being the Production or Manufacture of Europe, imported from Europe, is or hereafter may be fubject to, and may be warehoused and again exported ; subject refpectively neverthelefs to all and fingular the Regulations of an Act made and passed in the Twentyninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled, " An Act for repealing the Duties on To-" bacco and Snuff, and for granting new Duties in" " Lieu thereof :" And another Act paffed in the Thirtieth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to explain and amend an Act " made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Ad for repealing the Duties on Tobacco and " Snuff, and for granting new Duties in Lieu " thereof."

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, That any Rice, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, which shall be imported directly from, thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Manner above-mentioned, may, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty of Eight-pence the Hundred Weight, being Part of the Duties now payable on the Importation of Rice, be landed and warehoused (except as hereinaster excepted) under His Majefty's Locks, in fuch Warehoufes as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commisfioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, or any Four or more of them, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of the Remainder of the Duties due and payable for fuch Rice, within Eighteen Months, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Rice at the Time it shall be so landed : But it is His Majesty's Pleasure neverthelefs, that upon the Importation of any fuch Rice into the Ports of London, Briftol, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancafter, Falmouth, Pool, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty to enter and land the same without Payment of any Duty whatever; in , which
