Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorised by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, De-vise or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands. Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complete made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Perce, that any Person is endeavour ing to feduce my fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer h contracted or is preparing to go out of His Min : y's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, fe in Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Parson complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bird him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And, if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seflions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he thall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavout to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel. Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufac-tures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon In-diftment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indistment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indiament or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cale of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forfeit, for every Perton contracted with of feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to. fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome

tain, any fuch Tools of Utenfils as are commonly ufed in. or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of such Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debi, &t. in any Court of Record at Weftminiler, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It thail be lawful for any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Ma-elly's Watchoules, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find or Board any Veffel not bound directly to tome Port in Great Britzin or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized fhall; after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the beft Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majerty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain of Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veflel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeitONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefly, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but thall also forfeit his Em-poyment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

if any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly lusser to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall fue for the lame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefty.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Preis, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever, ufed in or proper for the working or finithing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof a and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffeffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cultom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
